I would first like to thank everyone for your support and patience during this first semester of the school year as we transitioned to a new standards-based grading system. While the gradebook might *look* a little different, rest assured, our teachers are continuing to hold students to high expectations for mastering content and for engaging in their learning through hands-on, relevant projects. Your continued support in ensuring students are at school, ready to learn, is truly valued. Our **Speech and Debate** team ventured north to Kamiak High School this weekend with a small yet mighty group of eight participants. Two of our outstanding competitors broke into the semifinals in three separate events. Senior Executive **Alexa Weinmaster** placed second in Spontaneous Argument. With a four and one record in the event of the Lincoln Douglass Debate, she also finished in sixth place in a highly competitive field and secured a second bid for the upcoming State Tournament. With an incredibly strong performance, sophomore **Daksh Sharma**, took third place in the novice Impromptu speech event. In addition, senior **Quinton Pho**, sophomores **Eliada Tran and Lovie Smith**, and 9<sup>th</sup> graders **Kei Louie, Mai Nguyen, and Katie Luu**, put on competitive performances and gained valuable experience setting them up for future success in their events. We could not do this without the help and dedication of parent judges, so a big shout out to **Doug Weinmaster**, **Aaron Smith, and Negendra Sharma**.

On Saturday, **RAHS Science Olympians** welcomed almost 400 middle school students and their families to participate in Washington State's second of three invitational tournaments. Twenty-one teams came from around the Puget Sound and Vancouver to demonstrate their knowledge of science and engineering. Approximately 20 of our Olympians volunteered to help make the event a success. From writing tests (Forestry, Disease Detectives, Rocks & Minerals, Code Busters, Crime Busters, and Solar System) to proctoring and grading (Bridges, Flight, Sounds of Music, Wheeled Vehicle, Storm the Castle) to setting up and cleaning up to entertaining an auditorium full of students and families during the awards ceremony; our team pulled off a fantastic tournament. The reviews from participants and coaches have been uniformly complimentary. Once again, our Olympians were proud ambassadors for our community!

Next up: On Saturday, 28 Jan, RAHS is hosting nearly 500 high school students from the Puget Sound, Portland, and N California in the second and final high school invitational for the season. After that, we are on for regionals in early March and, with work and focus, state in April.

The conference registration fee for admitted students is \$99; if the fee places a significant financial burden on a student's family, financial assistance is available as they do not want the fee to be a barrier for any deserving student.
