Your job may qualify for Worksite Learning - Cooperative (WSL). **Cooperative Worksite Learning (WSL)** is a learning experience where students practice in the community the skills and knowledge learned in the classroom. Typically, this is done through student employment, based on hours worked, learning objectives and employer evaluations. To participate, students must be at least **16 years old**, be employed and have passed Career Choices. 180 documented hours worked earns a 0.5 credit.
