This will be our last NOTAM of 2022! It is hard to believe this year has gone by so fast! I truly want to thank all of you for your support and partnership as we close out the year and head into 2023.

Partnerships are a huge part of our success and we are excited to be back in person with our **mentor** events! We had a great turnout this past week at our first mentor social event. We had several new mentors as well as returning mentors and lots of students attended! Thank you Mrs. Renee Olsen, and seniors Ali Karim and Hai Lin Truman for leading the program. Fantastic job!

Congratulations to our outstanding **Science Olympiad Team** for their showing at the Camas Tournament this weekend. Five teams of RAHS Olympians traveled to Camas for the first formal meet of the season. Over the course of the day-long contest, students tested their science knowledge and engineering mettle in events which ranged from anatomy to astronomy to environmental chemistry to cryptography to chronometry to flight. It was a day full of learning and new connections. Phoenix came in 4th overall in a field of 26 teams with a number of notable finishes from representatives from each of our groups. Among others:

- Tate Suarez and Madelyn Novick placed 2nd in disease detectives and 6th overall in life sciences
- David Mac and Ava Michler placed 6th in anatomy
- Shamik Das and Alem Alem placed 5th in dynamic planet and 6th overall in space sciences
- **Greta Kim and Opal Heltzel** placed 3rd in chemistry and in environmental chemistry; they placed 4th overall in chemistry events
- Richie Goodson and Nathan Trochalakis placed 4th in solar power and 4th overall in earth sciences
- Kei Louie and Makena Fajardo placed 6th in solar power
- Kaley Hoang, Sam Kavanagh, and Luna Smith-Fisher placed 2nd in code-busters, 3rd in experimental design, 4th in detector building, and 5th overall
- Muhammad Tunkara, Timothy Jou, and Eric Nguyen placed 2nd in experimental design, 3rd in Fermi Questions, Detector building, Wi-Fi lab, and 4th in code-busters, earning a 2nd place overall finish
- Adam Ermias and Noam Sorlie placed 5th in detector building
- Sirak Kebede and Caleb Hyun placed 1st in It's About Time, and 6th overall
- Salomon Ruvalcaba Rodriguez and Karl Anderson placed 4th in trajectory
- Gabe Adams and Brody Boyer placed 2nd in Flight; and 4th overall

As proud as we are of the team's overall performance, we are even prouder of the spirit with which they approached the tournament with an open mind for learning, stellar sportsmanship, and meaningful cooperation.
