Hello RAHS Families and Community -

What a fun time of year, celebrating student accomplishments, preparing for graduation, and taking time for traditions. This last Friday, we had a wonderful end-of year day full of traditions holding our year end awards ceremony, enjoying the ice cream social, and having just a little bit of fun in the teacher-student challenge (the **students** won, by the way!).

Congratulations go out to many students for being recognized in a variety of ways. Aaron Chang was recognized at the national level through the National Merit Scholarship Certificate of Merit, and at the state level, twenty-seven seniors were recognized as Washington Scholars (finishing in the top 10% of all students in the state), and 21 seniors received the prestigious Seal of Bi-Literacy for their performance in a language other than English. Class of 2022 seniors awarded Alan Grilley as their most Inspirational Scholar. Outgoing ASB President, who also helped MC the event, Katie Pacini, swore in our new ASB Executive Council, as well as the class senators for each grade level, AND the sophomore teachers recognized the top performers in the 10th grade KCIA Stormwater PBL! Students were also recognized for flight! Mr. McComb presented aviator pins for Solo Flights to Evan Pavavus, Jason Poon, Atticus Bhat, Lyra Young, Garrett Griner and Kellan Hoel. Way to go! Mrs. Olsen recognized those students who have gone above and beyond for their Community Service. This year our school total for all students was 7,441 hours! Wow! Leading the way were 9th grader **Sukhman Khangura** with 109 hours, 10th grader **Madelyn Novick** with 110 hours, junior **Sirak Kebede** with 414 hours, and seniors Joee Becht (260 hours) and Theresa Tran with 617 hours. The overall topperformer was senior **Leah Mathew** with an incredible 714 hours!

We also recognized students via some very special awards. In 2005, two inspirational Aviation High School budding pilots- both freshmen – were tragically killed during their Young Eagles flight. Each year, our school recognizes students across all grade levels who exemplify the ideals that these two young women upheld, via the Love of Life and Love of Learning awards. This year we were honored to award the Love of Learning to freshmen Josmar Barajas Valdovinos and Melissa Calderon Bracho, sophomores Richie Goodson and Maria Colis Canales, juniors Ellie Dykes and Opal Heltzel, and seniors, Lyra Young and Harpreet Saroya. Love of Life awards were presented to freshmen Nour Khalifa and Lutfiah Mustofa, Sophomores Taylor Nguyen and Jasmine Rivas, juniors Riley Pierce and Sakarleen Yok and seniors Esther Ko and Jonathan Hurley. Congratulations to you all for these very special awards.

And finally, our top seniors were celebrated with our Hubble and Phoenix awards – these awards recognize students who exemplify the mission, vision and values of our school (Phoenix) and those students who exemplify a drive and passion for their future (Hubble). Our staff recognized this year, **Ian McGaha and Smera Venkateswar** as recipients of the Hubble Award, and **Theresa Tran and Edward Duong** as the Phoenix. Permanent plaques with these awards, along with the Love of Life and Love of Learning, remain in our trophy cases at the school.

Congratulations again to ALL of our students who worked so hard this year - as we count down our final days, we wish the best of luck to the **Class of 2022** as they go on to amazing futures.
