Congratulations are in order for our **February Rotary Students of the Month** – **Jolie Ruiz and Jericho Encomienda.** Jolie and Jericho were honored at the monthly virtual luncheon where they were recognized for their leadership in our school, their academic success and their service to our community. During this Black History Month, we celebrate two women who have had a major impact on females in Aviation and STEM. Most of you have probably seen the movie "Hidden Figures", which highlighted the story of **Mary W. Jackson**. Jackson, born in 1921, was a brilliant mathematician, scientist and aerospace engineer. As a Black woman, her path to notoriety was not a direct path, nor an easy one; but at a time when any female engineer was rare, she broke down barriers to become NASA's first Black female engineer. In 1979, she joined Langley's Federal Women's Program, where she worked hard to ensure equal opportunities for future generations of women in NASA's STEM careers. Mary passed away in 2005, and we honor her for inspiring future generations of women engineers and her drive to create equality in STEM fields.

Despite being the first licensed Black pilot in the world, **Bessie Coleman** (1892-1926) wasn't recognized as a pioneer in aviation until after her death. Though history has highlighted Amelia Earhart or the Wright brothers, it was Coleman—who went to flight school in France in 1919—who paved the way for a new generation of diverse fliers like the Tuskegee Airmen, Blackbirds, and Flying Hobos. We honor Bessie for paving the way.


