Hello RAHS Families and Community -

This past week we recognized **Indigenous People's Day** on October 12—acknowledging the sacred lands we inhabit and honoring this country's founding Native Peoples. Did you also know that Native Americans made significant contributions to the aviation and aerospace industry? Mary Riddle, who was born in Washington, was one of the first Native American women to earn her pilot's license. She took her first solo flight in 1930 and later joined the Air Force's Civil Service so she could continue flying after WWII.

I am excited to share the work that our staff and community are doing in the area of combatting racism and becoming an anti-racist school community. Several members of the Black Student Union (BSU), parents (including members of the PTSA) and school administration met to collaborate on ideas and actions to move forward. This effort is beginning with teacher professional development during Wednesday time - utilizing the series **Facing Race** to examine our own understanding of anti-racism and how we can best serve our students of color. We are also looking forward to potential student panels and guest speakers in the future. We know this work is incredibly important to keep at the forefront of our efforts so that when we say as a school that we want all students to succeed, that we truly include all students. We hope that parents will join us for the next PTSA meeting (see information included in the NOTAM for dates/times) so that you can also learn more about the efforts from the parent team.


