Hello RAHS Families and Community -

This month, we are honored and humbled to celebrate **Native American Heritage Month**. Despite horrific treatment and deliberate attempts at erasing native culture, Native Heritage persists and is revitalized through the dedication of Native activists, artists, teachers, and leaders. This month – and indeed all year round - we celebrate Native American Heritage and recognize the contribution of the Native people to aviation and aerospace. This week we recognize the contributions of John Herrington, Chickasaw from Oklahoma. John was designated as a naval aviator in 1985, and, in over 30 different aircraft, has logged over 3,300 flight hours. NASA selected Herrington to participate in the 16th shuttle mission to the International Space Station in 2002, and he became the first Native American to walk in space. During his spacewalk, Herrington honored his Native heritage by carrying six eagle feathers, a braid of sweet grass, two arrowheads and the Chickasaw flag. He now gives presentations about his life throughout the country.

Raisbeck Aviation High School is a proud member of the **National Consortium** of Secondary STEM Schools. Each year, NCSSS hosts a conference, attended by educators from all over the US. Although this year's conference will be held virtually, we are proud to be represented on the national stage by teachers **Mr**. **Nik Joshi and Mr. Scott McComb**, and by student speaker **Jordyn Famimiko**. Mr. Josh and Mr. McComb will be leading a session on the effectiveness of our community involvement for students and Jordyn will be an opening session speaker talking about women of color in STEM education. We know they will do an amazing job representing RAHS.

Thank you to all of our staff and students as we close out our first quarter this year. Despite unbelievable challenges, you have all risen to the occasion as true Phoenix. Thank you for your continued dedication to success and your future.
